

An analysis of feedback from students is as follows:-

In this session, students wished some more facilities like R.O facility because the water in Palwal region is salty. They suggested some reference books in the library in various streams. They also expressed their desire that the college should start some PG courses in the near future so that they may not have to travel long distance for higher studies.

An analysis of feedback from parents is as follows:-

Although the parents appreciated the discipline and security arrangements in the college but some of them suggested that the college should have two permanent guards instead of gatekeeper at the college gate. They wished that their wards should be made aware regarding their rights (legal and social) and duties towards the nation and toward parents and society.

An analysis of feedback from alumni is given below:-
