An analysis of feedback from students is as follows:-

The students of various streams expressed their wish to have guest lecturers on specific topics and remedial classes from time to time specially for English and Maths. They also wished that the college should organize personality development classes and career counselling sessions.

An analysis of feedback from parents is as follows:-

Keeping in view the security of their girl children all the parents appreciated the decision of installing CCTV in the various parts of the college. They also requested that their daughters should be made physically, mentally and spiritually strong to face the hard challenges of life.

An analysis of feedback from alumni is given below:-

The alumni of this session suggested that it would be great if more heed is paid to develop presentation skills in girls students so that they would be able to stand up for their rights starting with family and they would be able to make use of the various opportunities that are available to them in the current scenario.

- In the beginning of the session, an academic calendar/plan of action is prepared which is followed by faculty and students.
- Syllabi booklet with division of the curriculum to be covered till a specified time-period and tentative dates of the monthly weekly tests.
- Performance in test records is analyzed in meetings with HODs
- Weak students are given personal mentoring
- On the basis of score of students and attendance, internal assessment is prepared.
