- In the beginning of the session, an academic calendar/plan of action is prepared which is followed by faculty and students.
- Syllabi booklet with division of the curriculum to be covered till a specified time-period and tentative dates of the monthly weekly tests.
- Performance in test records is analyzed in meetings with HODs
- Weak students are given personal mentoring
